Using a long curved line on a piece of paper, you can use your colours to create a repeating pattern (i.e., red, blue, red, blue) along the line! If you are using paint, you can use bottle caps or pom poms to dip in paint!

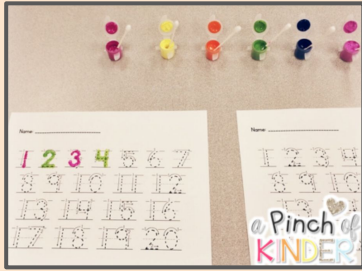

Q-tip Day! (Fine motor practice) La journée de la motricité fine!

Today's activities will help you to practice fine motor skills while getting creative! If you don't have Q-tips at home, you can try one of these alternatives:

- ★ A fine paint brush, the end of a straw dipped in paint, markers, crayons, finger paint, or small stickers



Option 1:

Option 2:

Rock, Paper, Scissors Day! La journée roche, papier, ciseaux!



Try this classic game in English or French! All you need is your hands! Here is how you play:

- 1) Face a partner and Say: Rock, Paper, Scissors or “Roche, papier, ciseaux” as you tap your fist on your other hand.
- 2) Choose a hand symbol:
 - fist (rock, roche) 
 - flat hand (paper, papier) 
 - 2 fingers pointing out (scissors, ciseaux) 
- 3) Rock beats scissors, scissors beats paper and paper beats rock. If you both choose the same symbol - it's a tie!

Human Rock, Paper, Scissors!

Try this version to get your body moving! Use these full body actions to show the symbols:

Rock: curl up in a ball

Paper: lie flat on the ground

Scissors: stand with legs spread apart and hands together over head

Try other variations (i.e., Superheros or animals) to replace the symbols of rock, paper and scissors.
